



## RECTOR'S RAMBLINGS

I got an email the other day from my brother in law Andrew saying how he's hoping to take a month off in the summer to walk from Oslo to Trondheim along St Olav's Way – 'not so much a "pilgrimage" for myself as much as to reassess life after 60 and reset work/life balance a bit.'

My first thought was I could do that with him! After all, a few years back, when he had announced that he wanted to repeat the walk that his father had made in 1994 as an escaping prisoner of war over the Appenine mountains in Italy I asked if I could come too – and did so! But my second thought was that this was his walk, not mine, and he didn't need me along this time. I did look up the way though. It's a 400-mile path through Norway from Oslo to Trondheim where the remains of the 11th century St Olav are interred in the cathedral. And in any case, my brother-in-law has a connection with Norway that I don't have (he lived and worked in Oslo when he was younger and his wife comes from Trondheim). My connection, as I wrote in last year's March magazine letter, is with The Way of St James, or, in Spanish, El Camino de Santiago. I've always felt an affinity with St James as my second name is James, after St James's Church, Stonesfield where I was born and my Dad was the Rector and one day I would like to walk from there to Santiago de Compostela, finishing at the cathedral where the remains of the apostle St James are interred.

And actually, as I write this letter, I have on my desk a map of west France because for my retreat this year I am walking just a little bit of that way, spending three days walking 60 miles down the Atlantic coast of France – a little trial run, as it were, of what would be a walk of over 1200 miles!

There's a Latin phrase *Solvitur ambulando*. It translates as It is solved by walking. It's an ancient phrase which bears witness to the therapeutic power of walking – something my brother-in-law is aware of when he talks about resetting his work/life balance. And alongside the map on my desk I have a book called *The Art of Mindful Walking*, written by Adam Ford, a retired Church of England vicar in which he talks about the healing power of thoughtful walking. In the introduction he says For 'thoughtful walking', there is no need to worry about the thinking – thoughts will arise quite naturally. In other words, don't take your mind for a walk, just go for a walk!

One essential item that I shall take on my walk is my staff, a simple wooden stick left over from coppicing which I picked up in a forest years ago. It accompanied me during

my 40 days in the Sinai Desert back in 2014. I say essential, not because I need it to help me in the physical act of walking but because it helps me walk in a more reflective way, a more thoughtful way. It reminds me that what matters is not arriving at a future destination but being in the moment of each step of the walk itself – remember that life is a journey not a destination.

And talking of journeys, my wife Judith and I will be travelling to America after Easter to celebrate Andrew's 60th birthday at his home in Texas. I think I shall take him a copy of Adam Ford's book as a present. And what I would like to leave with you is the thought that any walk can be a mindful one. It doesn't need to be as long as the ones I've talked about, it can simply be a walk to the shops or the end of the road. What matters is that you don't take your mind for a walk with its worries and daydreams that take you into the past or the future. You just go for a walk and be present in the moment. As another priest writer RS Thomas puts in in his poem The Bright Field:

*I have seen the sun break through  
to illuminate a small field  
for a while, and gone my way  
and forgotten it. But that was the pearl  
of great price, the one field that had  
treasure in it. I realize now  
that I must give all that I have  
to possess it. Life is not hurrying*

*on to a receding future, nor hankering after  
an imagined past. It is the turning  
aside like Moses to the miracle  
of the lit bush, to a brightness  
that seemed as transitory as your youth  
once, but is the eternity that awaits you.*

The ATA was a British civilian organisation set up during the Second World War that ferried new, repaired and damaged military aircraft between factories, assembly plants, delivery points, maintenance units, scrap yards and active service squadrons. It also flew service personnel on urgent duty from one place to another. Diana flew over 80 types of aircraft and delivered 260 Spitfires.

The terrible weather over the past weeks has evidently added to the ongoing problems of potholes and mud deposited on the roads by HGVs, particularly in Hathersham Lane in the vicinity of the earth processing site. The Parish Council has constantly addressed this problem and it has been made very clear that clearance of mud deposits on the road is the responsibility of Surrey County Council and not Tandridge District Council as SCC may tell you. This has also been confirmed by the Police so if any of you are reporting do not be put off.

A reminder for your diaries: **The Parish Annual Meeting will be held at 7:30pm on Monday 20 April.** This is your opportunity to learn what your council and associated bodies have been doing during the past 12 months and raise any questions that you may wish answered.

## COMMUNITY SPEEDWATCH

We now have our overall yearly figures: as a team we captured 2,960 vehicle registration numbers (VRNs) which is still far too many and even with the loss of Weatherhill Road, which was taken over by Surrey Police for priority monitoring due to the excessive numbers recorded by us, we are actually only 49 VRNs short of last year's figures. However, this is also taking into consideration the fact that we held 61 more sessions over the entire year, so the figures represent a huge drop in VRNs being captured from 40 to 18 cars per hour. The team is looking forward to continuing this work and hopefully seeing a drop again next year.

## BURSTOW AND SMALLFIELD WOMEN'S INSTITUTE

The speaker for the February meeting of Burstow and Smallfield WI was Nigel Dawson from Creative Talks – and we asked him to give a talk about the 1960s because most of our members were around then either as teenagers or young adults.

Nigel chose to talk about 1960-1963 because covering all of the sixties would have taken a couple of hours.

The 1960s seemed to change the world from black and white to technicolor – the time of Harold Macmillan and hope and promise after the privations of the post-war period. Policies were set in motion to allow many African and Caribbean countries to gain independence from Britain and the dismantling of the British Empire seemed to be complete.

There was a royal wedding on 8 May 1960 – Princess Margaret married Anthony Armstrong Jones. She wore a Norman Hartnell wedding dress and the ceremony was televised and was watched by 300 million people worldwide – I didn't know there were that many TVs around then. Notable films shown that year were 'The Magnificent Seven' and 'Spartacus' – which has been in the news recently due to the death of Kirk Douglas at the age of 103. He starred as Spartacus but never actually said, "I'm Spartacus". In December of 1960 the first episode of Coronation Street was aired – it recently celebrated its 10,000 episode.

Prices in 1960 saw the average house valued at £2,530, a loaf of bread was the equivalent of 5p and a professional footballer could only earn £50 per week – those were the days.

January 1961 saw John Fitzgerald Kennedy, the youngest President of the United States, inaugurated. He was the first Catholic president – youthful and handsome, he inspired great hope amongst Americans. They needed that because the USA and Russia were pitted against each other to put the first man into space. In the April, however, the Russians managed to put Yuri Gagarin into a 100-minute not quite whole orbit of the earth - the USA achieved slightly more later in the year when John Glenn circled the earth. 1961 also saw the advent of the Beatles – they would take the USA by storm rivalling Elvis.

1962 was memorable for The Big Freeze where the country was snowed in from the November until the next February – many of the WI had vivid memories of that chilly event.

1963 heralded the Profumo Scandal – recently retold in a serial on BBC1 – which brought down the government and exposed the double standards of those in power. In August of that year the Great Train Robbery took place – £2.6 million was stolen and it took decades to bring all the perpetrators to book.

In November, whilst on a motorcade driving through Dallas, Texas, JFK, the president of the United States of America, was shot and killed by an assassin – believed to be Lee Harvey Oswald. There have been over half a century of speculation and conspiracy theories about JFK's assassination – mostly because the perpetrator was himself killed by Jack Ruby before he could come to trial. JFK's death was an event that lodged in people's memories, many of them remembering exactly where they were and what they were doing when they heard the news.

Nigel's talk, accompanied by film clips and music of the time, raised many a memory – good and bad.

Next month's meeting will be at our new venue at the Centenary Hall, Wheelers Lane, Smallfield at 2.00pm on 10 March. The speaker is Dani Mamone talking about her adventures in a hot air balloon.

## CAMEO

### Come and Meet Each Other

The visitor to the February Cameo was paramedic Craig Prentice. Craig said that he had wanted to be a paramedic since he was excited as a young boy by the flashing blue lights on 'Casualty'! He had been a tearaway at school but did eventually fulfil his dream. Since then his career has literally taken off and he now has degrees in trauma medicine and works half his shifts in the A and E department at East Surrey Hospital and half on the Kent, Surrey and Sussex Air Ambulance, based at Redhill, where he flies day or night to emergencies all over the south east – many of them caused by motor bike accidents. The local service is the only one that can perform blood transfusions at the site of the emergency, thus saving many lives. The most serious cases are airlifted to St George's, Tooting, and Craig said that he is likely to feature in a future episode of '24 hours in A and E' as he arrives with a patient! His engaging personality prompted lots of questions and made for a very enjoyable afternoon.


